# 3. Warrant Register

Councilwoman Scott stated she has a couple of comments and one of the concerns she has already spoken with Director of Administrative Services Dantuono. On page 2, the YMCA water bill for October and November is \$18,528.64 and she just thinks that is outrageous and we really need to seriously consider artificial turf or something because we can't pay this. The other concern was on the very last page which was \$1,300 for a roundabout feasibility study. She wanted to know if a developer had requested that because it was something they wanted to put in their development, and she was informed no, that this was a Council thing and she doesn't recall the Council ever approving paying for a feasibility study on a roundabout. We did talk about a roundabout but we never approved anything to go ahead. It was just something that if someone wanted, that the developer should have to pay for it if they want to put a roundabout in.
