

## BYE BYE MATTRESS!

As of December 30th, California became the second state in the nation with a statewide recycling program for used mattresses and box springs. The program, known as Bye Bye Mattress, allows California residents to drop-off used mattresses at participating collection sites and recycling facilities for FREE.

The Bye Bye Mattress program is administered by the Mattress Recycling Council (MRC), a non-profit organization created by the mattress industry to develop and manage the recycling program mandated by law in 2013. The program is funded through an \$11 recycling fee that is collected when a mattress or box spring is sold to California consumers. Consumers will notice this fee as a separate line item on their receipt.



The fee is used to pay for transporting and recycling the discarded mattresses which ultimately makes recycling easier for California residents. The program aims to divert that bulky waste from landfills to recycling facilities that can turn it into other useful products. The polyurethane foam, steel springs and wood frames from Californians' used mattresses will soon become the material for carpet padding, landscaping mulch and new bedding.



**Community Trails Committee:** At the January 14, 2016 regular meeting, the Community Trails Committee considered the following items:

1. Election of Chairman and Vice Chairman  
*Congratulations Brent Meritheth and Mark Lyons!* The Community Trails Committee reelected Chairman Merideth and Vice Chairman Lyons.
2. 2016 Community Trails Day Selection Within the Harmony Specific Plan Site and Event Planning  
 The Community Trails Committee discussed and selected the Harmony Specific Plan trail to be used for the April 9, 2016 Community Trails Day and provided Staff comments and direction.
3. Discussion Items and Update related to Guidance for City Creek Trails Sign Design and Content  
 The Community Trails Committee provided Staff direction.

**Planning Commission:** At the January 19, 2016 regular meeting, the Planning Commission considered the following items:

1. Election of Chairman and Vice Chairman  
 The Planning Commission reelected Chairman Hamerly and Vice Chairman Gamboa. *Congratulations gentlemen!*
2. Conditional Use Permit Application (CUP-015-004) for the Construction of a Forty-Six Foot (46') Tall, Unmanned Wireless Telecommunication Facility (Mono-Eucalyptus) and Associated Landscaping and Fencing Equipment (Continued from January 5, 2016)  
 The Planning Commission voted to deny this item.
3. Conditional Use Permit Application (CUP-015-003); a Request to Replace an Existing Mono-Pole Antenna with a Sixty-Five Foot (65') Tall Co-Locatable Wireless Telecommunication Tower to Serve Two Carriers (Continued from October 20, 2015)  
 The Planning Commission adopted Resolution 2016-001 approving Conditional Use Permit (CUP 015-003), subject to the Conditions of Approval, as amended, and adopting the Findings of Fact.
4. Urgency Ordinance and Municipal Code Amendment (MCA-16-001) – Amendments to the City’s Municipal Code to Expressively Prohibit the Cultivation of Medical Marijuana in all Zones in the City and Consistent with State Law Prohibit Mobile Medical Dispensaries and Delivery in the City  
 The Planning Commission approved the following actions:
  1. Adopted a Notice of Exemption and Instructed the City Clerk to file a Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk of the Board; and
  2. Adopted Planning Commission Resolution No. 2016-002, recommending the City Council to adopt an Urgency Ordinance prohibiting the cultivation of medical marijuana in all zones of the City; and
  3. Introduce for first reading an Ordinance, continuing the prohibition on cultivation and prohibiting mobile medical marijuana dispensaries and the delivery of marijuana and marijuana products in the City.
