
Tennis Balls: Reboundes accept old tennis balls for recycling and refurbishing. The company will even e-mail you a prepaid shipping label to cover your expenses. Those brightly colored tennis balls should still be of reasonable quality, and you should wait until you've saved up a large amount. There are hundreds of millions of tennis balls manufactured world wide every year - approximately 20,000 tons of landfill waste! Golf Balls: For all of you golf fanatics out there, according to an Arizona-based company called

Dixon Golf, more than 300 million golf balls are discarded in the U.S. each year. That's enough golf balls to make a solid line from Los Angeles to London! You can bring in golf balls to a Dixon Golf retail location or mail them in for recycling. Ski Equipment: When your skis or snowboards just aren't cutting it anymore, consider recycling them instead of tossing them out.
