
Glenrose Ranch Homes Selling Fast

The Glenrose Ranch Planned Development by Richmond American Homes (located at the northeast corner of Greenspot Road and Boulder Avenue), with its 119 detached single family detached condominium homes, opened its model homes for business the weekend of April 9-10. That weekend the developer informs the City that they were overwhelmed with prospective buyers coming through the models and all of the eight units in Phase 1 sold. In the following two weeks all eight of the Phase 2 homes were sold and the developer subsequently applied for permits for the next three phases. Phase 1 homes are anticipated for completion and delivery in late August/early September.



This community offers 4 two-story detached residential floor plans ranging in size from 1,566 to 1,945 square feet and currently available in the low to mid-\$300,000 range. These homes are considered detached condominiums tied to a common motor court grouping on a common property but each home includes some private outdoor space surrounding the home. The project includes a recreation area with a pool, spa, a building with restroom and shower facilities, tot lot, benches and open turf areas for the exclusive use of the residents of the Glenrose Ranch community. All these amenities along with the common areas and roads will be maintained by the HOA.

April 30th is National Prescription Drug Take Back Day

On **April 30th from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.** the Highland Police Station and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public its 11th opportunity in six years to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs.

Bring your medications for disposal to the **Highland Police Station located at 26985 Base Line Highland, CA 92346.**

Last September, Americans turned in 350 tons (over 702,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at more than 5,000 sites operated by the DEA and more than 3,800 of its state and local law enforcement partners. Overall, in its 10 previous Take Back events, DEA and its partners have taken in over 5.5 million pounds—more than 2,750 tons—of pills.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.
