**Seat declared vacant on the Building Code Appeals Board (BCAB).** On April 22, 2014, the City Council declared once (1) vacancy on the Building Code Appeals Board.

The Building Code Appeals Board of the City of Highland consists of three (3) members and is appointed by the City Council. Two of the members shall be qualified by experience and training to pass on matters pertaining to building construction and the third member may be a lay person. The Board shall be any combination of professional individuals who are structural engineers, architects, general contractors or trade contractors.

One vacancy has been declared by the City Council, which term of office expires in June, 2016. The duties of the Board shall be to hear and determine appeals of orders, decisions and determinations of the City Building Official regarding the application and interpretation of the adopted Uniform California Codes, including but not limited to, the Uniform Housing Code and the Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings, herein referred to as the "building code" and undue hardship appeals of orders or determinations made by the Building

Official relative to Title III, Chapter 9, Subpart I) of the American with Disabilities Act, Public Law 101-336. The City Council is tentatively scheduled to make the appointment at their regular meeting of June 10, 2014, pursuant to Government Code. All appointees serve without compensation, will need to complete an ethics training course and will have to submit an FPPC Statement of Economic Interest Form. Highland residents wishing to be considered should file an application with the City Clerk prior to the close of business **JUNE 2, 2014**. 

Keep a list of the type and model numbers of the medical devices you require, as well as medication. Be sure to make provisions for medications that require refrigeration. Make arrangements for any assistance to get to a shelter.
