Many of our regular volunteers with the Highland



REPETE'S WISDOM OF THE WEEK -

Old Tires Get New Life with CalRecycle Grants. In May the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) awarded 74 grants, ranging from \$9,824 to \$150,000, through the Tire-Derived Product Grant Program. The City of Highland will receive \$64,060.00 to be used for rubber landscape mulch in two Landscape Maintenance Districts. The City is the only grant recipient in San Bernardino County.



Rubber tires have properties such as shock absorbance, water resistance, skid resistance, and durability that make them ideal for other applications after they can no longer be used on vehicles. Rubber landscaping mulch is not absorbent, so plantings require less water, fertilizer, and pesticide. It also does not compact, which cuts down on the need for future applications. Qualifying projects must use a total of at least 2,500 waste tires generated in California.

The Tire-Derived Product Grant Program and other recycled tire grant programs are funded from CalRecycle's share of a \$1.75 surcharge on each tire sold in the state. The programs are designed to help make the market for recycled waste tires sustainable and ensure they are made available for beneficial use rather than sent to landfills or worse yet, to illegal waste piles,

where they pose a fire hazard and attract mosquitoes and vermin.
