July 4th - Don't get burned on Independence Day

Leave the Fireworks to the Professionals. In recent years, many residents have complained about illegal use of fireworks throughout the City of Highland. This year, the Highland Police and Fire Departments wishes to remind residents that all fireworks (safe and sane included) are prohibited within the City of Highland. It is a violation to own, use or sell any type of fireworks within the City of Highland. Use of fireworks may result in citation and fine up to \$1,000 or arrest, or both.



The Highland Police Department will have extra officers working over the July 4th Holiday period. Fireworks will be confiscated and violators may be cited or arrested. Possession of explosive devices such as M-80's, M-1000's and Rocket type fireworks is a felony. Individuals may be held liable for damages (and parents may be held liable for damages caused by their children) not only from the use of fireworks, but for the cost for response by the Fire and Police Departments. Violators will be prosecuted, Highland Municipal Code Chapter 8.58. We wish all residents and visitors a happy and safe Fourth of July Holiday.



Fireworks, animals and the 4th of July. Please remember your pets as they are terrified of the fireworks, loud bangs, etc. and usually will run away if given the chance.

Please secure your animals in the house, garage, etc. with food and plenty of water for them and reassure them. If they do run, (and they can run a long way!!!) remember to check at the San Bernardino County Animal Care and Control facility at (800) 472- 5609, and even the Redlands Animal Control at (909) 798-7644.

3rd Street/Victoria Avenue Intersection Improvements

Glenrose Ranch Grading Begins

Rough grading work is scheduled to begin the second week of July, 2015, on the vacant property which is bounded by Greenspot Road, Boulder Avenue, Orange Street and Beattie Middle School. Pre-watering of the site is scheduled to begin on Monday, June 29, 2015. Pre-watering is necessary in order to loosen the soil and to mitigate dust during grading operations. The pre-watering process is expected to last about 7 continuous days.

This project, known as Glenrose Ranch, will consist of 118 detached condominium units along with a private recreation area, which will include a pool, a tot lot, a barbeque area and restrooms, to be managed by a Homeowners Association. After pre-watering, the rough grading work will establish grade for the future street and level "pads" for housing construction is expected to take about 4 to 6 weeks.

Construction is scheduled to begin next week at the 3rd Street/Victoria Avenue intersection by the Inland Valley Development Agency.

This project will provide an improved ground access into the proposed San Bernardino County Sheriff's airport facility. This project includes reconstructing the street pavement with new structural section within the intersection, approximately 300 feet east and west of the intersection, and approximately 200 feet north of the intersection; installing storm drain system; replacing the existing three-way traffic signal with a new four-way traffic signal; constructing new curb returns and access ramps at all four corners of the intersection; and widening the intersection to ultimate width.

During construction, there will be no full closures of 3rd Street or Victoria Avenue. Traffic will be shifted to one side of 3rd Street and Victoria Avenue to allow for phasing of construction. Construction is expected to be completed by early September.
