HIGHLAND INDEPENDENCE DAY PARADE
Monday, July 4, 2011 at 9 am - 11 am

Parade Route: Parade begins on Base Line between Church Ave. and Bonita. Parade will travel west on Base Line to Central Ave. The parade will travel south on Central Ave. to Hibiscus Street. The parade will travel east on Hibiscus and conclude at Miriam.

Parade Announcements: Announcer will set up in front of City Hall on Base Line. Parade will begin with the singing of the National Anthem and the San Bernardino County Sheriff helicopter flyover.

INDEPENDENCE DAY COMMUNITY PICNIC
Monday, July 4, 2011 10am - 2pm

Highland Community Park, 27003 Hibiscus Street.

The Independence Day Picnic will feature a softball tournament, vendors, stage performances, karate demonstrations, traditional competitions such as three legged races, watermelon eating, and sack races. Entry to the picnic is FREE.

Engineering

SR 210 Lane Closures. In addition to the ramp closures, Caltrans will be performing pavement rehabilitation work on the portion of SR 210, between 5th Street in Highland and Interstate 10 in Redlands. This work will consist of removing and replacing areas of pavement, which are currently in poor condition.



SR 210 will have a minimum of 1 lane open to motorists in both directions during construction. Based on the current schedule, Caltrans is looking to begin work on July 6, and is expected to work within the project limits for 20

nights, from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., performing paving, fog seals, re-striping and traffic detector loop replacements. Please see schedule below:

7/6/11 - 7/9/11 - Paving from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am, SR 210 Westbound and Ramps (May be some work performed in Eastbound lanes).

7/9/11 - 7/10/11 - Paving from 11 pm to 7 am, SR 210 Eastbound lanes and Ramps.

7/11/11 - 7/18/11 - Traffic loop detectors and lane striping replacement.

Schedule may be changed due to site conditions.
