

Used Oil Filter Exchange and Recycling Event

The San Bernardino County Fire Department's Household Hazardous Waste Program and the City of Highland's Public Services Division are hosting a free Used Oil Filter Exchange and Recycling Event.

Date: October 8, 2016

Time: 9am to 2pm

Location: AutoZone 27292 Base Line Highland, CA

Keep in Mind...

1. Bring up to 3 used oil filters to recycle and exchange for new oil filters
2. Expiration Of Exchange is October 8, 2016 at 2pm
3. Valid In-Store Only at the address listed above
4. No exchanges or refunds
5. Recycle oil filter safely: drain for 12 hours and transport in non-leaking container or bag.
6. Bring ID or utility bill for residency verification.

Oil filters are composed of steel and are 100% recyclable; if all the filters sold each year in the U.S. were recycled, **160,000 tons of steel would be recovered**. Recycling one ton of filters yields 1,700 pounds of steel, 30 gallons of used oil and saves 10 cubic yards of landfill space. Used oil filters can be recycled into new steel products, such as steel cans, cars, appliances and construction materials (for example, rebar). UPDATE – SUMMER TRAVELING VS. ZIKA VIRUS & BLOOD DONATION

The Zika virus is having a serious effect on blood donation here at home. LifeStream has taken appropriate steps in accordance with FDA guidelines to ensure the safety of the local blood supply. Now, we're asking you to join the effort.

How? **BLEAD BEFORE YOU BOARD!**

We're losing – local hospitals are losing – potential blood donors, and at a crucial time of year, too. While some in our community can't donate blood due to recently returning from Zika-affected countries, many of our friends and neighbors are out of town during spring break.

But you can help. If you have no travel plans, please give blood to help maintain ample supplies for patients in local hospitals. And if you're going out of town soon, put blood donation on your "trip prep agenda." Amidst the planning, packing and excitement for your upcoming journey, set aside as little as one hour to visit a LifeStream donor center or mobile drive before your ship sails or plane takes off.

We ask that donors self-defer from donating blood if within the past 4 weeks any of the following statements are true:

- You have been outside the 50 United States or Canada.
- You were diagnosed with a Zika infection.
- You have had two more of the symptoms listed following recent travel (within 2 weeks) outside the 50 United States or Canada: Fever; joint or muscle pain; eye pain or redness (conjunctivitis); headache; rash.
- You have had sex with a man who, in the past 3 months was diagnosed with a Zika infection OR has been outside the 50 United States or Canada.

BLOOD DRIVE



The City of Highland held another successful blood drive this past Monday. With a whopping 29 appointments set, we were able to obtain 23 units of blood for our community. This is especially appreciated because it's during the hot summer months that donations are at the lowest. You can still donate this summer down at the LifeStream Donor Center. Remember that deferrals are high during the hotter months so before donating, hydrate, hydrate, and hydrate! Being hydrated will also help with and speed up your blood flow during the actual donation process.

LifeStream is always appreciative of donors giving the Gift of Life and shows them by offering special incentives. On Monday, LifeStream entered each donor into a drawing for the opportunity to win a pair of Southern California CityPASS tickets. Emergency Preparedness – Maintaining your Kit

Just as important as putting your supplies together is maintaining them so they are safe to use when needed. Here are some tips to keep your supplies ready and in good condition:

- Keep canned food in a cool, dry place
- Store boxed food in tightly closed plastic or metal containers to protect from pests and to extend its shelf life
- Throw out any canned good that becomes swollen, dented or corroded
- Use foods before they go bad and replace them with fresh supplies
- Place new items at the back of the storage area and older ones in the front
- Change stored food and water supplies every six months. Be sure to write the date you store it on all containers
- Re-think your needs every year and update your kit as your family's needs change
- Check batteries. Throw out any that are corroded or discharged and replace with fresh ones
- Check medication and first aid items. Throw out any that are beyond their expiration date and replace

Keep items in airtight plastic bags and put your entire disaster supplies kit in one or two easy-to-carry containers, such as an unused trashcan, camping backpack, plastic tote bin or duffel bag. For more information about disaster preparedness, please visit www.ready.gov.


