Library News



you would like to recycle at your organization's next event, we can help! The City of Highland Public Service Division has ClearStream® CycleMax portable units for beverage container recycling at events. They are highly visible and easily recognizable as a recycling container. Each portable recycling unit consists of: frame, lid, labeling, and clear plastic bags.

The loan-out program is available to community groups, non-profit organizations, and others who wish to collect and properly recycle beverage containers generated at their event.

You are responsible for collecting and recycling the materials generated from the event. Upon completion of your event, you must recycle the collected items in Highland and provide the Public Services Division with a copy of the recycling receipt.


